ASSISTANCE LEAGUE OF ST. LOUIS BRINGS 120 STUDENTS TO THE SAINT LOUIS ZOO FOR NEW ATHLETIC SHOES AND MORE

WHAT: Sixty volunteers of Assistance League of St. Louis are bringing 120 deserving children from St. Louis City's Dunbar Elementary School to be fitted for new athletic shoes and socks. At Assistance League's third consecutive Discovery Day, the children will also get new books and healthy lunches. They can participate in a fun dance exercise and learn about the conservation of cheetahs at the Saint Louis Zoo, long home to cheetahs and where, in 2017, eight cheetah cubs were born, marking a first in Zoo history.

WHY: New athletic shoes are fitted on approximately 3,500 St. Louis area school children each year by Assistance League volunteers who work not only at the annual Discovery Day but who travel to three elementary schools in one day and fit the children (grades K through 4) with the latest styles and colors in athletic shoes. In a single school year, volunteers will visit 37 schools in eight school districts. Assistance League's philanthropic partner, Shoe Carnival, provides invaluable help in the form of three employees who work alongside Assistance League volunteers each fitting day.
