ASSISTANCE LEAGUE OF ST. LOUIS MARKS BEGINNING OF SCHOOL WITH NEW UNIFORMS FOR 60 CHILDREN

This is the year's first of 60 fittings for thousands of local school children

Assistance League on Wednesday, August 15 is marking the beginning of the school year by fitting 60 Kindergarten through fifth graders from Barack Obama Elementary School in Normandy District with new, clean school uniforms and much more.

Beginning August 15, Assistance League volunteers will be fitting children from 30 schools over 60 dressing days through January 28. School children will be coming for fittings from the school districts of Ferguson-Florissant, Hazelwood, Jennings, Riverview Gardens and St. Louis City, in addition to Normandy. In the 2017-2018 school year, the organization served 7,834 elementary school students.

Each year, through its Operation School Bell program, Assistance League volunteers contribute 5,700 hours to give each student two pairs of pants, two short-sleeve and one long-sleeve shirt, one fleece jacket, socks, underwear, a toothbrush, toothpaste, a hat and gloves (and for each girl—a headband or a bow). Each student also receives a book of the child's choice.

"Research shows that clean well-fitting new uniforms help create positive outcomes for students and for learning," said Assistance League of St. Louis President Roxie Randolph. "Each year, for 31 years, Operation School Bell, our largest program, has helped provide new uniforms to school children in need. At these fittings, each child receives the attention of a caring volunteer, who helps the child with the perfect fit. The volunteers love seeing the wonderful smiles on the children's faces, and the children leave with new uniforms and a new sense of pride."

She adds that in 2018 alone, Assistance League members and friends donated 80,000 volunteer hours through nine philanthropic programs, touching 43,341 lives.
